To that end, the City contracted for its own full-time Forensic Identification Specialist II (FIS II) to be assigned to Cerritos Station and funded its own autonomous Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) worksite. Latent fingerprints are lifted by trained Law Enforcement Technicians and certified City Community Safety Officers. The program has been so successful that the surrounding cities are entering into agreements with the City of Cerritos to coordinate the contracting of retired Sheriff's Department FIS II technicians to assist in expanding AFIS data entry and identity certifications.

A "kidprint" service is also offered, which provides parents with a copy of their child's fingerprints for safekeeping in the event of a future emergency or criminal incident. Operating hours for the center are 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Saturday, and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday. With approximately 30,000 to 50,000 shoppers per day and more than 7 million vehicles accessing the center per year, the Los Cerritos Center greatly benefits from the new in-house safety center.

An additional twenty-five students are then removed from their classrooms by The Grim Reaper, simulating their deaths and making a bigger impact with students.</p> <p>All participants are then taken away and kept overnight in hotel, away from friends and family. During this time, mock death notifications are made to parents of all participants. A reunion with classmates and family takes place the following day at school.</p> <p>The purpose of this event is to raise awareness of the possible consequences of drunk driving. The program has been a huge success, and extremely popular with students since its inception in 1997.</p>
