Synopsis: The West Hollywood Community Impact Team is a combination of four Community Oriented Policing and Problem Solving deputies, (C.O.P.P.S.), four Special Problems Unit deputies, (S.P.U) and three Sunset Policing Team Motor Units. The team is managed by a Lieutenant and supervised by one sergeant.

The team's mission is station patrol augmentation. The team is responsible for handling quality of life issues. This includes, but is not limited to, Sunset Boulevard enforcement, directed/saturation patrol and assistance to units within the station. (C.I.T. deputies conduct prostitution enforcement, transient sweeps and probation searches). The team also conducts DUI/CDL and Cruising checkpoints, and helps with A.B.C. enforcement of liquor laws. Another function of the team is to coordinate and participate in neighborhood and business meetings, city functions and community special events.
